Paula Pacheco - Paula Pacheco holds a BA in Civil Engineering from Universidade de Brasilia, a specialization in Strategic Planning and an MBA in Financial Management from FGV. She has been working at Casa Thomas Jefferson for 33 years. With both academic and administrative backgrounds, Paula currently holds the position of Shared Services Center Corporate Manager.



Lucia Santos - Graduated in English Language and Literature from Universidade Católica de São Paulo, with a master's degree in Applied Linguistics from the University of Brasilia. Lucia has extensive experience working as a teacher trainer in the field of Linguistics and has been working at Casa Thomas Jefferson for 43 years. Lucia is currently the Executive Director.

In today's rapidly evolving educational landscape, institutions face various challenges, from rising operational costs to increasing demands for better student services. To navigate these pressures, many institutions are adopting Shared Service Centers (SSCs) as a solution. This session explores the strategic role of SSCs, using Casa Thomas Jefferson, the Binational Center in Brasília, as a case study. It will show how SSCs integrate key services like finance, HR, and IT to boost efficiency, reduce costs, and foster innovation. Attendees will learn how centralization improves institutional performance and enables reinvestment in academic excellence. ----- This session explores the strategic role of a Shared Service Center (SSC) in fostering innovation and integration within educational institutions. Participants will learn how centralizing administrative functions—such as finance, HR, IT, and student services—into an SSC can streamline operations, reduce costs, and boost efficiency. The session highlights how SSCs enable leadership to focus more on innovation by reallocating resources to academic and research priorities. Using Casa Thomas Jefferson, a Binational Center in Brasília, Brazil, as a case study, the presentation will show how centralizing services improved efficiency and integration, allowing the school to reinvest savings into innovation and the student experience. Time permitting, a brief Q&A will follow to address participants' questions.

Student Use of Artificial INtelligence: What to Fight and What to Surrender

Junior Codi is an English teacher and educational technology analyst in the BNC ICBEU Manaus, an alumnus in more than one of the American Embassy programs, and has a degree in Filmmaking by the UEA (University of the State of Amazonas) and post-graduate certificate courses including English Language Teaching and Second Language Acquisition. He has taken part in several projects involving culture, educational technology, and community outreach.



Alexandre Mendonça

This session helps teachers navigate the growing use of Artificial INtelligence in student work. Many educators, lacking formal training in AI, struggle to find the balance between embracing this INnovation and maintaining academic INtegrity. We will provide strategies for detecting Al-assisted plagiarism, setting appropriate boundaries for AI use, and INtegrating AI as a supportive tool in the classroom.

This workshop will provide teachers with guidance in navigating AI in the classroom, a tool that most educators have had no formal training in. As AI tools rapidly reshape student learning habits, many teachers are unsure of how much AI use is acceptable, or how to assess work that may be partially or fully Al-assisted. The presentation will address three areas: INtrospection - INnovation and INtegration - and INclusion.

Teachers will have practical strategies for detecting Al-generated work, setting boundaries on its use, and designing assignments that allow for responsible AI use.

Rebecca Ernest - As Regional Public Engagement Specialist in Buenos Aires, I lead public diplomacy across five countries, integrating AI through an embassy-led working group and establishing public-private partnerships with U.S. companies to enhance American Spaces. My work centers on expanding U.S. engagement and fostering inclusive, impactful community connections.

In this workshop, I will build on insights from my recent ABLA Express presentation with Wesley and Roberta, providing the strategic foundation of our American Spaces partnership and the core principles guiding our programming. This framework will serve as the launching point for an interactive session that enables participants to develop a program that aligns with the Six Pillars of American Spaces while centering on Introspection and Innovation—key themes of the ABLA 2025 Conference.

Following the presentation, we will dive into a hands-on group workshop focused on the full lifecycle of program planning. Each group will collaborate on designing an American Spaces program, engaging with strategic planning tools to identify target audiences, set measurable goals, and integrate elements that reflect our collective values and priorities. This session will empower participants to craft relevant, reflective, and forward-thinking programming, addressing local needs while enhancing international engagement.

The goal is to foster a reflective space where participants can critically assess the role of American Spaces within their communities, drawing on diverse insights to ensure impactful and meaningful outcomes. By the end of the session, participants will have the tools and strategies needed to replicate this process in their own centers, strengthening their unique contributions to the American Spaces network.

Creating & Thinking with Al: Language, creation & possibilities

Short Bio:



Mariana B. Zanelli is an anthropologist, EFL teacher, and translator. She holds a Bachelor's degree in Social Sciences from the Federal University of São Carlos (UFSCar) and is a postgraduate student of Education and Technologies at UFSCar and exploring AI in language teaching at the University of São Paulo (USP).



Natália C. Silva holds a Bachelor's degree in English, Brazilian Portuguese, and Literature from the Federal University of São Carlos (UFSCar) and has been an EFL teacher since 2018, teaching both teenagers and adults while also learning from them.

This presentation discusses the integration of AI to improve foreign language learning in a Brazilian BNC. The goal is to explore how AI can be used to enhance students' engagement and critical thinking skills. We asked AI itself to create a lesson plan on speculative language and AI tools. We want to empower students to use AI to create and analyze content, practice language skills, and critically reflect on the impact and limitations of AI on education and society.

This presentation focuses on implementing AI to develop students' competencies in the classroom. Students participate in weekly, two-hour sessions over eight months, completing four maker projects inspired by selected SDGs, which foster both individual and collaborative growth.

During the presentation, we will outline the course structure, pedagogical methods, and tools, high-lighting curriculum elements that provide cultural exposure through a Fellow guest talks on American culture and contributions from an EducationUSA adviser to encourage student participation in the Youth Ambassadors Program. We will share data-backed outcomes, including language proficiency improvements, engagement in cultural activities, and feedback on STEAM projects. Additionally, attendees will gain insights into the program's broader impacts, such as enhancing students' employ-

ability and preparing them for competitive exchange opportunities.

For teacher educators, the impact of AI prompts a need for assisting teachers to develop new competencies. Training teachers in technology isn't sufficient. This presentation encourages reflection and dialogue to explore the complexities and proposes new frameworks for teacher development, and an understanding of the opportunities and challenges in Al-enhanced language teaching.

Al tools such as ChatGPT, Gemini, Canva and Grammarly are used in education. Teachers use them for lesson planning, materials development, grading, feedback. Learners use AI for writing, researching, virtual tutoring and conversation simulations. And behind this scenario, lies the daunting question: Will AI replace teachers?

As educators of English teachers, we ask ourselves what new competences teachers need to develop. This presentation seeks to explore new frameworks in teacher development programs for teachers to be better skilled to face the challenges of the technological revolution.

This panel discussion will focus on two new, innovative programs implemented by the American Spaces Venezuela Network, including the nationwide EdUSA Virtual Mock Fair program and the EdU-SA Professional College Counselor Network program. These programs implement new approaches to the work of American Spaces and are critically important as the U.S. Embassy to Venezuela is on

suspended operations and U.S. travel is restricted.

The EdUSA College Mock Fair is a simulation of a visit to a U.S. university that occurs on Venezuelan soil. This outreach program started in 2016 with trained volunteers representing participating U.S. universities and colleges at local college fairs throughout Venezuela. These mock fairs were initially created as English-learning exercises, then they quickly became very popular EdUSA outreach events, reaching thousands of prospective Venezuelan students. These events provide accurate information regarding U.S. undergraduate and graduate studies to prospective Venezuelan students and their families.

The EdUSA Professional College Counselor Network program is working with the American Spaces team and 50 college counselors across Venezuela to create a dynamic counselor network to facilitate interaction with their U.S. counterparts that will increase the number of students pursuing higher education opportunities in the United States and strengthen the EdUSA brand in Venezuela. The program is also working to support the establishment of a formal professional association for this community.

This session presents E-CAP – the Employability and Career Advancement Program, a pilot initiative launched in September 2024 that supports the English Language Teaching and Skills Development pillars of the American Spaces Program. E-CAP was developed over nearly a year of strategic planning and collaboration, beginning in October 2023, with guidance from the U.S. Consulate in São Paulo. Created through a deliberate process that integrates local community needs, U.S. Mission objectives, available resources, and the specific expertise of the participating BNCs, E-CAP is funded by the American Spaces Support Funds and represents a partnership between three BNCs in Brazil's São Paulo Consular District: CCBEU Sorocaba, SP; ICBEU Londrina, PR; and CICBEU São Carlos, SP.

Targeting underserved groups—including public high school and first-generation university stu-

dents, first-time job seekers, and individuals between jobs, ages 18 to 35 with an A1 or A2 level of English—E-CAP enhances participants' English proficiency and essential soft skills to improve their employability, especially with U.S.-based companies operating in Brazil. The program includes 200 hours of synchronous English language instruction and asynchronous soft skills courses, delivered through a custom-designed Learning Management System (LMS).

This presentation will cover the program's development, from initial discussions with Consulate São Paulo, curriculum design, and LMS creation to building partnerships with local companies and institutions, participant selection, and course launch. We will also discuss challenges faced, offering practical insights for audience members interested in implementing similar initiatives in their communities.

This issue is not unique to Bolivia; throughout Latin America, students from underrepresented backgrounds face similar obstacles. This panel will focus on how EducationUSA advisors from Bolivia and the U.S. Embassy in La Paz are addressing these issues through culturally sensitive SEL practices.

The panel will discuss methods for equipping students with the socio-emotional tools to overcome barriers and build emotional resilience. This session delves into the hidden curriculum—the implicit messages transmitted through class-room culture, teaching methods, and institutional practices—and its impact on AlianzaPRO's scholarship and paid programs for unemployed adults, informal workers, and those seeking reskilling or upskilling. We'll explore how hidden curriculum elements shape motivation, self-efficacy, and engagement, and how AlianzaPRO's approach fosters job readiness through teamwork, problem-solving, and professional behavior. The presentation highlights the roles of teachers and coordinators in promoting adaptability and critical thinking, aligning implicit learning with workforce demands.

This session aims to explore the concept of the hidden curriculum— the implicit messages and values conveyed through classroom culture, teaching methods, and institutional practices—and its impact on AlianzaPRO scholarship and paid programs designed for unemployed adults, informal workers or workers seeking for reskilling or upskilling. We will examine how the hidden curriculum influences student motivation and self-efficacy, emphasizing the role of empowerment and respect in fostering confidence and engagement. Key classroom dynamics and power structures will be analyzed, highlighting how certain approaches to feedback, assessment, and teacher-student interactions affect retention and engagement.

Conversations about sensitive topics can be challenging. Meaningful learning happens when the classroom is both a brave space and a safe space—where everyone is open to considering new perspectives. This practice of establishing and maintaining a brave space and safe space in the classroom can be reinforced and applied to learning beyond civics. Our classroom is a melting pot of these varied experiences, making it essential to provide a place where every student feels comfortable expressing themselves on any topic. In this session, participants will explore strategies to cultivate brave and safe spaces that foster respectful dialogue and deeper understanding among students.

Building trust or brave spaces in a student-centered learning environment can be as simple as designing activities that help students connect with one another. In this session, participants will define what a brave space means, discuss its key elements, apply brave space principles through classroom interactions, and identify one action to create or participate in a brave space. They will also explore tools and resources that can help transform spaces into safe and brave environments.

Inclusive Imagination: Building 2D Games to Empower Neurodiverse Children

In 2023, ICBEU Manaus launched the Game Factory program, an inclusive initiative within the Maker School designed to empower children by creating 2D games. This innovative program focuses on leveraging the creative potential of children on the autism spectrum and their neurotypical peers, teaching them essential game design and development skills. The program enhances technical abilities and promotes social skills, creativity, and confidence, aligning with ICBEU Manaus' mission to foster inclusive, impactful education.

The presentation will address three key areas:

- **1-** Differentiation and Individuality: This section will highlight how the Game Factory program recognizes the unique strengths and needs of both neurodivergent and neurotypical children. The program ensures that all participants can thrive by creating an inclusive, supportive environment. The curriculum is structured to accommodate different learning styles, allowing each child to express their individuality through game design and digital animation.
- **2-** Innovation and Intelligence: The Game Factory program introduces participants to cutting-edge game development tools such as Scratch and GameMaker Studio. Children gain essential coding, logic, and problem-solving skills, which fosters technical intelligence. Through hands-on learning, participants engage in innovative approaches to creativity, exploring how their ideas can be transformed into interactive digital experiences.
- **3-** Integration and Introspection: The program's collaborative nature promotes social integration, encouraging teamwork and communication among participants. Children develop a sense of belonging

and community by working together on projects. Additionally, the program fosters introspection by allowing students to reflect on their learning experiences and personal growth, building confidence and self-awareness.

The presentation will include visual aids, video clips, and testimonials from students and educators, showcasing how the program has transformed the learning experiences and social interactions of children on the autism spectrum. Pre-program assessments ensure that the curriculum meets the diverse needs of each participant, providing a differentiated and customized learning experience.

The session will showcase how this initiative aligns with differentiation, individuality, innovation, and integration, promoting educational and personal development. The program's success demonstrates how STEAM education can empower children by nurturing their technical and social skills, providing a model for differentiated education that can be replicated globally.

This session highlights the Institud de Formación Docente Paraguayo Americano's (IFDPA) efforts to strengthen English teaching across Paraguay. This session will explore in-house mentoring at the Centro Cultural Paraguayo-Americano (CCPA) and a nationwide program supporting rural public school teachers. Attendees will gain insights into effective mentoring strategies that foster self-reflection, skill-building, and adaptation to local needs. Interactive elements, including reflection questions and a Q&A, will encourage participants to consider how these approaches can enhance English education in diverse settings.

The session focuses on the need for teacher programs in Paraguay, and will highlight disparities between urban and rural teaching contexts. We will explore the CCPA's in-house mentoring, where new and experienced teachers engage in pre-service training, class observations, and ongoing professional development to refine their practices through feedback and self-reflection. Next, we will share the IFDPA's collaboration with the MOE in a program designed to support English teachers in Paraguay's public schools, especially in resource-limited rural areas.
